Weekly News Briefs
June 19th through June 26, 2011

During the past week Police responded to 92 calls for service.

Citizens are cautioned regarding numerous deer roaming the municipality this spring/summer. The deer are frequently on the streets during hours of darkness and can be difficult for motorists to see. On June 19th a motorist took evasive action to avoid striking a deer and struck a parked vehicle. Fortunately there were no injuries.

A business on Oak Bay Ave., was entered overnight on June 19th.

On June 20th, an Oak Bay police officer checked a suspicious male pedestrian. The male was found to be in possession of a white powder believed to be crystal methamphetamine. Charges of possession of a controlled substance are being recommended against a 45 year old.

On June 19th, two girls were walking in the Foul Bay Cadboro Bay area. A dark coloured vehicle, believed to be a Dodge Challenger pulled over and stopped. The girls report the male was masturbating in the vehicle. The male is described as a Caucasian male 25 years, with short blonde hair. The vehicle had louvers on the back window. Police are requesting assistance in identifying this male.

In the early evening of June 20th, an unknown couple brought an injured cyclist with a head injury into the Royal Jubilee Hospital. Police are seeking to identify the couple to assist in the investigation.

On June 21 the driver of a motor vehicle turned across the path of a bicycle rider on Beach drive at Windsor Road. The cyclist struck the vehicle and was thrown some twenty feet. The cyclist was taken to hospital with minor injuries. The motorist received a violation ticket.

A short time later a second accident involving a cyclist and a motor vehicle. This incident occurred on Beach Drive at Cattle point. Again a vehicle turned across the path of a cyclist resulting in a collision. The driver of the vehicle in this incident failed to stop. Police are requesting assistance in identifying the offending vehicle.

During the day on June 22 a home on Midland Road was subject of a Break and Enter. The culprits gained access by breaking a window.

On June 23rd an extremely intoxicated male attended a care facility to visit his wife. He subsequently took her for a walk in a wheel chair. The male inadvertently tipped the wheel chair off the sidewalk, causing both to fall onto the roadway. The lady was subsequently returned unharmed to the facility and the male was lodged in cells until he was sober.
