## News Release

**Date:** January 9, 2012

During the week of January 01-08, 2012, Oak Bay Police responded to 85 calls for service.

January 01- Just after midnight officers were called to a large house party in the 2000 blk of Kings Rd. One of the party goers had allegedly been assaulted by another in an unprovoked attack. A 28 year old male has been identified and charges will be recommended to crown.

January 01- 0130 hrs. Police were called to an apartment in the 2200 block of Cadboro Bay Road for a domestic assault in progress. The victim was allegedly assaulted by her husband while she was holding her infant. A 26 year old man was arrested at the apartment. The man has been charged with assault causing bodily harm, three counts of fail to comply with a recognizance , and Criminal harassment.

On January 02, a resident in the 2000 blk. of Falkland Road found his utility trailer had been stolen. The trailer is described as a 4'Elite expandable trailer.

January 04, an unknown culprit painted a "swastika" sign in the skate board park at Oak Bay Recreation centre. The graffiti was quickly removed by municipal staff.

January 06- Police required assistance in attempting to locate an elderly disorientated male who left his residence on beach drive at approximately 3 pm. Coast Guard Auxiliary assisted police by searching the waterfront for the male. A media release was sent out & thankfully at approximately 1030 p.m. a radio listener spotted the male walking several kilometres away in Saanich. Police were contacted & the man was reunited with his family.

January 06- At approximately 9 pm., Police were dispatched to the report of a robbery behind the Oak Bay High School. Three teenage victims report that they were approached by three teenage males. The victims were threatened with bear spray if they did not produce money and cell phones. Property was turned over to the suspects who fled. Three suspects were later identified by police and investigation continues.
